PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

The Holy season of Lent is a season of longing. It is a longing to discover something much deeper than what we can perceive with our eyes or understand with human intellect or achieve by human efforts or accumulations. This longing is the mysterious awakening to our yearning for God.

St. Augustine writes about our deep need and longing for God in his Confessions. He writes, "You have made us for yourself, and our hearts are rest-less till they find their rest in you." Augustine's writings lead us to center ourselves in God and the mysterious thirst we have that can only be satisfied by God. Consider the God-shaped hole.

The "God-shaped hole" speaks to us of a void in the soul/spirit/life of every person that can only be filled by God. The "God-shaped hole" is the innate longing of the human heart for something outside itself, something transcendent, something "other." Psalms 63:1 expresses this heartfelt plea for God.

"O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water." Psalm 63:1 NIV

These words penned by the Psalmist beautifully illustrate the human longing and dependency on God, recognizing that true fulfillment is found in God's presence. Imagine being in a parched land desperate for water. We need water. Jesus stood and shouted to the crowds, "Anyone who is thirsty may come to me! Anyone who believes in me may come and drink! For the Scriptures declare, 'Rivers of living water will flow from his heart." (When he said "living water," he was speaking of the Spirit, who would be given to everyone believing in him."

Pray with me this prayer from "Meditations for Apostles of Sensitiveness" by Howard Thurman.

God, I need Thee.
When morning crowds the night away
And tasks of waking seize my mind;
I need Thy poise.

God, I need Thee.
When love is hard to see
Amid the ugliness and slime,
I need Thy eyes.

God, I need Thee.
When clashes come with those
Who walk the way with me,
I need Thy smile.

God, I need Thee.
When the path to take before me lies
I see it...courage fleesI need Thy faith.

God, I need Thee.
When the day's work is done,
Tired, discouraged, wasted,
I need Thy rest.

The next Red Cross Blood Drive is scheduled for Friday, August 16, 2024.


